CIPS Corporate Award Practitioner Programme (SCQF7:HNC Equivalent)

Scotland Excel delivers the CIPS Corporate Award Practitioner to the Scottish public sector as a first step to candidates obtaining MCIPS (i.e. full membership of The Chartered Institute of Procurement & Supply).

MCIPS is an internationally recognised award which represents the global standard for a procurement and supply professional.

Highlights of this programme include:

- content that is specifically customised by Scotland Excel's procurement experts for the Scottish public sector
- applied-learning methodologies foster deeper learning than via exams
- the collaborative and co-operative activities and the work-based assignments, in which candidates practically apply key procurement skills to real-life work, drive learning directly and immediately into the purchasing organisation providing a return on investment, and
- online workshops are complemented by guided learning opportunities through Scotland Excel's award-winning online Academy

How is the course structured?

The Practitioner programme is a work-based alternative to the self- study and college-based exam routes. It equates to the CIPS Certificate, Advanced Certificate and Diploma and consists of an induction workshop and 6 full-day workshops, covering:

- Driving value through procurement and supply
- Managing expenditures with suppliers
- Sourcing essentials in procurement and supply
- Developing contracts in procurement and supply
- Effective negotiation, and
- Integrative assignment workshop

The Practitioner qualification can be standalone or lead to candidates undertaking the Advanced Practitioner programme.

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Essential Information

How will the course be delivered?

The programme is delivered by Scotland Excel's public procurement experts who have a proven record of delivering this programme.

Each module uses the "flipped classroom" methodology: prework by candidates avoids lectures and permits collaborative and co-operative practical activities in workshops instead. This, and post-workshop activities, guides candidates on how to successfully complete each assignment.

Who is the course aimed at?

Public sector employees in Scotland who undertake procurement at an operational level.

How much does it cost?

The Practitioner programme costs £2,700 per learner for public-sector learners, £2,475 per learner for associate members of Scotland Excel and £2,250 per learner for Local Authority members of Scotland Excel.

Course Dates and Delivery Method

Conditional upon minimum demand, Practitioner Cohort#9 is planned to commence on 31st August 2022, with the final unit workshop delivered on 20th September 2023. Courses are run online via our Academy Portal.

How is the Course Assessed?

Four assignments (three of 3,000 words and one of 5,000 words) are undertaken. Assignments are submitted to the Scotland Excel Academy, and then to CIPS for assessment. Marks and feedback are provided by CIPS within 7 weeks of assignment submission.

How much time will it take me?

In addition to the full-day workshops, candidates should expect to work independently for at least 16 hours per month (comprising guided learning activities and completion of assessments).

How can I expect my employer to support me?

Purchasing organisations are strongly advised to provide the candidate with an inhouse mentor to guide them on their function's practice and to provide other support.

What qualification will I receive if successfully completed?

On successful completion of the course candidates will receive the CIPS Practitioner Award.
